

- 1. Shiva Panchākshar Stotram: the power of Shiva and the five sacred syllables: na-ma-shi-va-ya. He who recites this Panchakshara near Shiva, will attain the abode of Shiva and enjoy bliss.
- 2. Shiva Prātah Smaran Stotram: recited in the early morning to invoke Shiva's blessings. I bow down in the morning to the infinite, eternal Being, who is beyond the darkness of ignorance, who is resplendent like the sun, who is everything and on whom this entire universe appears. One who reads every morning these sacred verses grows towards the supreme state of liberation.
- 3. Lingāshtakam: a strotram (hymn) in praise of Sri Shiva. The Linga is a symbol for Shiva on this worldly plane. The Lingasthakam Stotram is a prayer formed of eight salutations or invocations offered to the Supreme Deity in his aspect as Linga. Linga is the universal symbol of creation and source of everything. This prayer glorifies Shiva Linga and details its greatness.
- 4. Mahā Mrityunjaya Mantra: chanting this mantra creates higher vibrations that aid in healing, removing fear, anxiety and other negative emotions associated with death. The mantra is also known as a moksha mantra that connects human beings to their own inner divinity, it evokes the Shiva within human beings and liberating one from the cycle of death and rebirth.
- 5. Shiva Tāndava Stotram: it is said that anyone who reads, remembers and recites this stotra is purified forever and obtains devotion in the great deity Shiva. Written by Ravana centuries ago, from the great Indian epic Ramayana. Most know the arrogant side of Ravana, but only a few know about his incredible devotion to Lord Shiva. Chanting or listening to Shiva Tandava Stotram confers one with immense power, beauty, and mental strength. It is said that chanting the stotram removes all negative energies and makes the atmosphere pious.

- 6. Rudrāshtakam: a sacred text composed by Sri Goswami Tulsidas expressing the qualities of Shiva. I worship Him who is beloved of his devotees, who is Shankara (another name of Shiva) and who is the deity of All. Those who recite this with sincere devotion will be pleased.
- 7. Shivāshtak: Stotram composed by Sri Adi Shankaracharya. "Whoever recites this hymn of eight stanzas in praise of Lord Shiva near Shiva Lingam, will attain the abode of Shiva and enjoy His Bliss."
- 8. Shiva Shadākshara Stotram: Salutations to Shiva in the form of OM with its dot, which is always contemplated by great sages; who fulfills all desires and gives salvation. Salutations to Shiva in the form of NA, who is worshipped by sages, gods, Apsaras and men. Salutations to Shiva in the form of MA, who is the greatest god, who is the greatest soul, who is obtained through difficult penance, who destroys even the most heinous of all sins. Salutations to Shiva in the form of SI,who is peaceful, who blesses the universe, and who is eternal and peaceful. Salutations to Shiva in the form of VA, who rides on a bull, who wears on his neck the snake Vasuki, and who holds Goddess Shakti on his left. Salutations to Shiva in the form of YA, who is present wherever the gods abide, who is the greatest god, and who is the Guru of the gods.
- 9. Kālbhairavāshtakam: Kalabhairava means the dark one, the dark aspect or deadly form of Shiva. We all know that at the moment of death, we have no choice but to let go. This has significance when we die while being in this body, the death of ego, as well as the death of the physical plane or the worldly life, when we pass to eternity. Ashtakam is derived from the Sanskrit word astā, meaning "eight", an ancient composition with eight stanzas.
- 10. Om Namah Shivāy: 'I bow down to Shiva' or 'I venerate Lord Shiva.' May Shiva bestow you with his blessings.



Sanskrit is known as the language of the Gods. Its alphabet is like a mantra with immense power. Sanskrit is said to have emerged from the sound of Shiva's drum, known as Damru, which he also played as the universe was created. These sounds are able to create, maintain, regulate, transform, destroy. Such is the power of sacred sound, such is the energy of Shiva mantras, stotras and prayers in this album. Feel His energy through this music and these ancient texts, which can have amazing power and protective, uplifting, energizing, transforming effects.
